LCFC invested **\$24,714** in improvements to the barn, pastures and paddocks and farm supplies, in addition to volunteer contributions.


LCFC raised \$43,154 to invest in DeKalb County's very special Little Creek Horse Farm park.

# Schooling Show Co-hosted by LCFC and Atlanta Riding Academy

#### Mark's Fun Day

In 2018, for the first time, Mark's Riding School and LCFC hosted a special event to raise money for cancer research. Several of Farm regulars have been fighting cancer this year and the value of research has never been more apparent.

At Mark's event, riders competed in mounted games - from musical chairs to trotting with a full glass of water (even harder than it sounds).

\$4,100 which was all donated to the Cancer Research Institute and Emory Winship Cancer Center.

# Programs & Committees



#### OATS – Our Area to Share

The area surrounding our park including the track along the creek up to Valley Brook Road has great potential for a trail system. Our Multi-Use Trail /Creek Clean Up Committee was formed to gather information and provide ideas on best practices for multi-use trails. Due to the need and interest, the Committee also works on creek clean up. The group met several times in 2018 with 5-10 volunteers turning out each time. Everyone is welcome to participate.

Other activities include partnering with sister parks, development of a sensory trail, and creating an Audubon Society sanctuary.

#### Hands on Horses

Hands on Horses tours are a wonderful outing for small groups from Girl Scouts to families, to retirement groups. Each tour includes a visit to the Barn and pastures, demonstration of natural horsemanship, and a craft project.

For 2019, LCFC is expanding Hands on Horses with regularly scheduled tours available to the community two days weekly, weather permitting.

Of course, regular riders at Little Creek introduce visitors to the horses daily.



#### Safety Committee

In June, LCFC and Stride Ahead hired TLAER, Inc. to do a fire and general safety audit of the facility. The report recognized Little Creek's many strengths and provided recommendations for making the Farm safer.

As a result, Stride Ahead, LCFC and farm management formed a Safety Committee to oversee safety for both horses and humans.

The Safety Committee and farm management have already addressed key recommendations including the installation of larger fire extinguishers and an AED, removing flammables, and moving the hay storage from the barn. More underway.



## Little Creek Stable Squad

Meeting every Saturday at the barn, assistant trainer, Donna Coshatt, teaches kids from 8 to 16 about horse care, at no charge. There are currently **20** children in the program.

Students learn about grooming and tacking horses, sweep wash stalls and aisles, clean tack, and assist other students with what they have learned about horsemanship.

Working with each other and horses the youth learn confidence, leadership, teamwork, patience, kindness, and the importance of remaining calm, as horses are sensitive and mirror our feelings.




#### **Vendors & Merchandise**

#### **Sunset Pavilion**

On June 21, 2018 LCFC dedicated the new Sunset Pavilion. This 20' by 12' covered platform has the best sunset views in Atlanta. It's in constant use for picnics, viewing riders in the arena, and small gatherings of all kinds.

Built with funds raised by LCFC, including generous memorial donations from the families of Cheryl Watson and Nancy Elrod, as well as a Small Change Grant from Park Pride, the Pavilion is a wonderful addition to the Farm. The Conservancy added a sidewalk to make the pavillion fully accessible from the barn.

#### Creek Cleaning & Park Pride Orientation

Little Creek's Friends of the Park (FOP) Group is a proud affiliate of Park Pride. Through the FOP, Park Pride shares wonderful resources with LCFC such as:

#### Mirror Mirror on the Wall

Dressage mirrors are a feature of barns where riders train with precision.

27 donations specifically for weightless mirrors. The mirrors will be installed in February 2019 at one end of the indoor arena. The Conservancy will provide matching funds for this project.



#### It Rained and Rained and Rained

With over **70** inches of rain, 2018 was the second wettest year on record for Atlanta. Over 20 extra inches of rain meant flooded pastures at Little Creek Farm and the horses often had to stay inside.

When pastures flood, volunteers and owners and staff walk Little Creek's horses two to three times every day. Around and around the indoor arena they go.

Pasture clean up is scheduled for the next LCFC work day.



# Around the Farm

#### Commissioner Adams, Commissioner Bradshaw

& Capital Improvements

Commissioner Bradshaw, with the support of the DeKalb County Board of Commissioners, allocated \$215,000 in District 4 Parks Bonds for Little Creek Horse Farm improvements in 2017. Those funds will be fully invested in 2018 and 2019.

The Commissioners, under the leadership of Commissioner Adams, also allocated \$270,500 for capital improvements which will be in place by the end of 2019.

Commissioner Kathy Gannon committed \$32,500 toward the master plan for Little Creek Farm Horse Park.

#### Stride Ahead

Stride Ahead served over 55 clients in 2018 supported by **2,845** volunteer hours. Stride Ahead provides about **30** lessons per week for students with various physical or mental challenges, supported by approximately **75** volunteer hours each week.

Stride Ahead begins its tenth year of providing Equine Assisted Therapies at Little Creek Horse Park in 2019!

Stride Ahead partnered with Connections School of Atlanta to provide 4 weeks of 2 hour weekly sessions. The horses helped the kids learn life skills such as communication, body language, and leadership. We hope to continue this rewarding partnership with Connections School.



## Atlanta Riding Academy

Atlanta Riding Academy offers safe high-quality hunt seat riding lessons and promotes educational opportunities at Little Creek farm such as horsemanship classes, horse shows and other experiences essential to overall equestrian education.

#### In 2018 Atlanta Riding:

- Maintained an active client roster of 32 students.
- Launched the Atlanta Riding On-Line Guide to Horsemanship which includes two levels with video illustrations and quizzes.
- Volunteered both riding students and lesson horses in many Conservancy events.

Due to high demand for lessons and modest client turnover there are 55 people on the wait list for lessons.



# Mark's Riding School


For more than 25 years, Mark Jaglarz has been teaching beginning riding, English pleasure, dressage, and jumping at Little Creek Horse Farm.

He and assistant trainer, Donna Coshatt, have shared their knowledge and love of horses with hundreds of new and experienced riders.

School horses include: Silverado, Cooper, Valor, and Sweetheart, as well as a shared horses owned by other boarders such as Big John, Max, Gracie, Dillon, and Panda.

Mark's Riding School provides over 30 classes weekly, including individual and group lessons, serving people from age 7 to 85.

# DeKalb County's Little Creek Team

Little Creek Farm saw major staff changes this year. Long time supervisor, Joe Magnusson, moved to other roles in DeKalb County.

Chuck Ellis joined as Department Director, Recreation, Parks and Cultural Affairs in February 2018. He immediately recognized the value of Little Creek Farm and has been a critical part of park improvements. David Flaherty came on as manager over Little Creek and other parks, and Joy Lambert became the new Barn Supervisor.

With change have come new expertise, new approaches, new insight, and new energy.

As part of the transition, we are seeing new uses of old spaces. The old feed room is now a tool room, the old tool room is now a feed room, and the office is becoming a viewing room. LCFC invested \$2,240 in rat-proofing the new feed room.
