Year End Reports:

Sherree Wallace - Outreach: Barn Tours are overbooked and Sherree thinks we may need to increase the amount of tours and start having the tour every Saturday. She needs horseshoes- not sure what has happened to them. She has also changed the format a little bit- some of Mark's younger students are riding for the tour groups- tour seems to like the "show". We had 300- 325 visitors last year. Sherree plans to keep larger groups in Parelli pasture. She has groups from St. Andrews preschool, other preschools, Day care centers for adults and mental health centers. Groups are of a varied and from a large region. Barn tours are still taking the winter months off.

Birthday Parties: ongoing debate on whether the Conservancy should do Birthday Parties. We would definitely need a different person to handle this project (Sherree cannot do both). This would be a big project and would have to be run like a business.

Carolyn Brown Volunteer Coordinator: Last year more volunteers than people at fall festival due to rain. Clean up day we had 22 people. Dave Butler could use some Boy Scout groups to help with trail off Orion.

 Bridge is open and far mares pasture is open- not sure when mares are going out there.

- No news from county on rehabbing paddocks.
- There was an incident with sprinkler system coming on with riders in arena- this has been taken care of and sprinkler systems indoors and out are no longer on timers.
- Sand has been added to arena and now it needs more of the fabric material.
- Shout out to Nancy Scott- She is an indefatigable worker. She talked to fire department, bought and applied reflective tape on stalls for easy open. She is willing to spread fly predators.
- Pony Rides: stop line at 3:15 so as not to go over the time limit for volunteers and horses.
- Fun Day is June 8 and we will combine with volunteer appreciation party.
- Dana McDaniel / Karla Postma: News from- Rogers Electric and Fan Company Identified outdoor fan one for each 2 wash stall, quiet, low voltage, cools large area,
 used in equestrian areas. We will also have switch put in for outdoor arena. They will
 pull down florescent lights, and put in new lights over each wash stall and add extra
 outlets to each wash stall. ALL FOR FREE.
- Will be a busy year, installing safe fans, continue beatification and look at having more clinics.
