We look forward to getting back to normal, interacting with volunteer groups like these 4H students displaying their sweeping prowess.


Armed with Covid guidelines, a few outdoor volunteer projects were accomplished in 2020.

Captains (mainly, experienced riders and Program staff) and approved volunteers have been stepping up since March to support Little Creek with designated tasks.


The County, the Community and the Conservancy say *Thank You* for helping keep the staff healthy and the barn open to the extent that it is.

Environmental Committee

Environmental projects enhance the Park and educate the community about the value of green space and wildlife.

The Park is home to more than horses - deer, beaver, birds of prey - and other native wildlife are plentiful.


Equestrian Programs

Atlanta Riding Academy

Atlanta Riding Academy offers hunt seat riding lessons and promotes horsemanship education at Little Creek Horse Farm & Park.

In 2020 Atlanta Riding:

- Maintained a client roster of 38 students and lessors
- Taught an average of 34 lessons per week
- Participated in a video demonstration for the Fall Festival
- Created a socially distant client horse show
- Worked with LCFC to raise \$2,285 for new trees at the Park
- Welcomed a new horse named Hi Jinx, a thoroughbred/saddlebred cross gelding

Mark's Riding School

Mark Jaglarz offers 40+ years of professional experience with English riding, jumping and horsemanship. All levels participate in private or group lessons.

2020 stats for Mark's Riding School:

- Current roster: 30 students
- Weekly average: 35-40 lessons per week
- Added 2 new lesson horses: Rosie the sweet Pony (currently in training to become a superb lesson pony) and Norman, the talented Thoroughbred.
- \$200 was raised for Cancer Research this year, despite Quadrille practice being on hold.

Stride Ahead

When COVID hit in mid-March, Stride Ahead had to shut down their therapeutic riding lessons indefinitely.

While not able to conduct those lessons, thanks to a grant from The Arthur Blank Family Foundation, Stride Ahead began stress relief sessions for front line medical workers and first responders.

In addition to these stress relief sessions, Stride Ahead was able to conduct stress relief sessions for veterans thanks to a grant from The Evelyn Foundation. These sessions take place in the grass arena and follow all CDC safety protocols.

In 2020 LCFC invested **\$10,719** in improvements to the barn, pastures, and paddocks and farm supplies, in addition to volunteer contributions of time, energy and materials.

LCFC had revenues of **\$25,661**. Net proceeds will be invested in DeKalb County's unique Little Creek Horse Farm & Park.



- •LCFC has **\$91,242** in funds for projects and matching grants to support Little Creek Horse Farm & Park, as of December 31, 2020.
- As of publication, LCFC has been awarded access to a \$50,000 matching grant from Park Pride, to use on Dekalb County approved projects at this Park in 2021.
